THE STORY OF THE PLAY

THE AUTHOR THORNTON WILDER

Regarded by many as America's greatest living playwright, Thornton Wilder is also a distinguished novelist. His classic THE BRIDGE OF SAN LUIS REY won the 1928 Pulitzer Prize, as well as an international reputation for its

Mr. Wilder was born in Madison, Wisconsin, but soon moved to China, where his father was Consul General, first at Hong Kong, later at Shanghai. Wilder was educated in China, at Oberlin College and Yale, studied archaeology in Rome and took his M.A. at Princeton.

Mr. Wilder has taught at the University of Chicago, Harvard, and many foreign universities. He served in North Africa and Italy in World War II as a lieutenant-colonel in the Air Force. Two of Mr. Wilder's plays, OUR TOWN and THE SKIN OF OUR TEETH, have received the Pulitzer Prize.

Wilder is also the author of the novel THE IDES OF MARCH and the play THE MATCHMAKER, upon which is based the current Broadway hit musical HELLO DOLLY.
