# LES TROIS COUPS. (THE THREE KNOCKS)

TRADITIONALLY IN THE FRENCH THEATRE, AS THE LIGHTS GO DOWN, THREE LOUD KNOCKS (WOOD AGAINST WOOD) ARE HEARD. THESE THREE BLOWS MARK THE BEGINNING OF THE SPECTACLE. TODAY IN THE COMMEDIE FRANCAISE OF PARIS, AS IN THE DAY OF MOLIERE, THESE THREE KNOCKS ARE STILL USED. THEY WERE USED FOR THE PREMIER PERFORMANCE OF THE WOULD-BE GENTLEMAN BEFORE KING LOUIS XIV IN THE CASTLE AT CHAMBORD IN 1670 AND THEY WILL BE USED TONIGHT.

### MOLIERE (1622-1673)

MOLIERE, ONE OF THE FOREMOST COMIC PLAYWRIGHTS
OF ALL TIME, AUTHORED NEARLY THIRTY FULL-LENGTH
PLAYS DEALING ESSENTIALLY WITH A SOCIAL MANIAC OF
ONE SORT OR ANOTHER, SUCH AS TARTUFFE (THE RELIGIOUS
HYPOCRITE), THE MISANTHROPE, THE MISER, THE WOULD-BE
GENTLEMAN, AND THE IMAGINARY INVALID. THE PROTAGONIST
IN EACH PLAY IS A VICTIM OF HIS DWN EXCESSIVE
ENTHUSIASM OR DESIRE FOR SOMETHING WHICH PUSHES HIM
TO ACT CONTRARY TO COMMON-SENSE AND EVEN IN DEFIANCE
OF NATURE.

MOLIERE AND HIS CONTEMPORARIES LIVED IN AN AGE IN MANY WAYS QUITE UNLIKE OUR OWN. TO WRITE FOR MATERIAL PROFIT, FOR EXAMPLE WAS GENERALLY CONSIDERED A FLAGRANT ABUSE OF ONE'S ART. WORK FOR GLORY, NOT FOR SORDID GAIN, WAS THE WAY BOILEAU, ONE OF MOLIERES LITERARY ACQUAINTANCES, PUT IT, AND A MARKED APPRECIATION FOR REFINEMENT AND GOOD TASTE ON THE PART OF THEIR LARGELY ARISTOCRATIC PUBLIC HELPED TO SET THE TONE THAT GENERALLY PREVAILED IN THE ARTS AND LETTERS OF FRANCE IN THAT DAY

AND YET MONEY HAD ITS PLACE THEN AS NOW. THE TYPICAL BOURGEOUIS UNDERSTOOD THAT MONEY COMMANDS ATTENTION, EVEN RESPECT, AND THAT IF ONE COULD AMASS ENOUGH OF IT IT COULD LIFT HIM INTO THE RANKS OF THE NOBILITY. MR. JOURDAIN, THE PROTAGONIST IN MOLIERE'S THE WOULD-BE GENTLEMAN (1670), HAS THE NECESSARY MONEY TO BEGIN CLIMBING THE SOCIAL LADDER, BUT THE POINT SEEMS TO BE THAT MONEY ALONE DOES'NT MAKE THE TRUE GENTLEMAN.

NOTICE THE TITLES OF MOLIERE'S PLAYS. HE IS NOT CONCERNED WITH A SOCIAL TYPE, BUT WITH THE MISER, THE RELIGIOUS HYPOCRITE, THE HYPOCHONDRIAC, THE SOCIAL CLIMBER, AND SO ON. MR. JOURDAIN IS THE ARCHETYPE, HE IS ALL SOCIAL CLIMBERS ROLLED INTO ONE, AND MOLIERE'S PLAYS LIVE TODAY BECAUSE HE DEALS WITH SUCH MANIACS WHO ARE PART OF EVERY SOCIETY. INDEED THERE IS AT LEAST A BIT OF THE WOULD-BE GENTLEMAN IN EACH OF US.
