#### MORE THEATRE

The Brigham Young University Department of Theatre and Cinematic Arts, in an effort to present entertaining as well as stimulating theatre experiences, creates several productions in other theatres. Listed on the following pages are these additional dramas, comedies, and musicals not included in the Pardoe Theatre Season Book. These productions are housed in the Phillip N. Margetts Arena Theatre and the Miriam Nelke Experimental Theatre (both in the Harris Fine Arts Center), and the Law School Reader's Theatre in the J. Reuben Clark Law Building.

The Margetts Arena Theatre Season is devoted to the production of premiere performances of new scripts or translations. The Nelke Experimental Theatre Season is devoted to the production of classic or experimental dramas and comedies. The Law School Reader's Theatre Season provides provocative scripts using exciting performance techniques.
