

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

When I first read Mother Courage, I was an undergraduate at BYU and never really understood the concepts and conventions that Brecht was attempting to bring to life. Now, as a director, I am beginning to understand the brilliance of this playwright and how groundbreaking his aesthetic was.

In using Brecht's techniques of alienation to tell the story of a simple woman and her family, my appreciation of epic theatre has grown immensely. As we approached this production conceptually, we were attempting to symbolize the destruction of war on the most basic level: the family, mothers, sons, and daughters. Mother Courage is all of us, struggling to survive by selling her wares-she cannot see that she is the problem. The imagery of the tree and cart are the reflection of her world. The family tree is herself, and the cart is her survival. Her attempt to capitalize off war to stay alive is the very reason she loses everything she loves, her family, and in so doing never sees or learns anything. That is tragedy.

In telling this story Brecht wants us to see ourselves. Are we learning nothing, and in so doing, doomed to continue the cycle of war over and over? "Ever learning and yet never able to come to the knowledge of the truth?" Are we the problem? Are we continuously circling our family tree decorated with the strange fruit of our blind choices?
