

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The Story:

Children's author Alice Cornwinkle knows her life is falling apart. Her marriage is unraveling and her creative genius is fading fast. Her daughter Chloe, a fan of Lewis Carroll, reads a bit of his famous Jabberwocky poem to her mother after a particularly brutal day. Alice quickly falls asleep and journeys into a charming but bizarre Victorian dreamscape straight out of "Alice in Wonderland." She finds her dreamland populated by strange creatures oddly reminiscent of friends, family, and foes from her everyday life.

Alice follows after Chloe, who has chased a curious White Rabbit down the proverbial rabbit hole and into Wonderland. In this sometimes nightmarish and sometimes wacky world, Alice is forced to play a game of chess which requires her to pass through many doors, solve many riddles, and ultimately checkmate her rival and be crowned Queen. Only by winning the game can she be reunited with her daughter and return to real life.

But a funny thing happens on the way to winning the game. During her quest, the magic of Wonderland and its wonky inhabitants begin to remind Alice of her youth and "the green, golden days" of her childhood. The "secrets hidden in her heart" once again surface as her zest for life returns while struggling through the obstacles Wonderland presents. Like Dorothy in the Land of Oz, Alice's love for family and her creative spark are rekindled and she returns home a changed person.

Our Approach:

Lewis Carroll's famed Alice stories create a dreamscape where the only constant seems to be that "anything goes." After 150 years, literary aficionados still do not agree on what the author intended his eclectic dreamland to mean. However, most agree the text captures the random and crazily jumbled nature of human dreams better than any other work of fiction. In keeping with the randomness of the dreamscape, Frank Wildhorn's *WONDERLAND* features an incredibly tuneful poprock score that includes a nod to several music genres. Each song is as unique as the character that performs it, and the dancing the songs inspire is equally multiform.

Our visual approach to the piece includes a Victorian-inspired landscape appropriate for any re-telling of the *Alice in Wonderland* tale. However, the residents of our Wonderland are adorned with clothing that includes an outrageous nod to current hipster culture. Our production strives to capture Mr. Carroll's enduring sense of human dreams that simply know no bounds.

Shani Robison, Associate Professor of Dance (BYU), has presented ballet pedagogical research and choreography at professional conferences in Canada, Ohio, Texas, Colorado, Massachusetts, and New York. Three of Shani's contemporary ballet works, *African Winds* (2008), *Concealed* (2009), and *Interrupted Impulse* (2012), were selected to be performed in ACDA/NW gala concerts with *Interrupted Impulse* selected as an alternate for the national festival. Shani has choreographed full-length original ballets for BYU Theatre Ballet including *Romeo and Juliet* (2009) and *Cinderella* (2011); mentored student choreographers for *Alice in Wonderland* (2015); restaged *The Sleeping Beauty* (2013) and *Swan Lake* (2014); and choreographed for several operas, including BYU's *The Phantom of the Opera*.

Recent credits include head dramaturg for *Steel Magnolias* and *Angel Street* at Provo's The Covey Center for the Arts. Tim is head of the music dance theatre (MDT) program and a director at Tuacahn Center for the Arts. His most recent directing credits include *Chariots of Fire* at BYU and *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* at Tuacahn, where he will direct *The Sound of Music* this coming summer.
