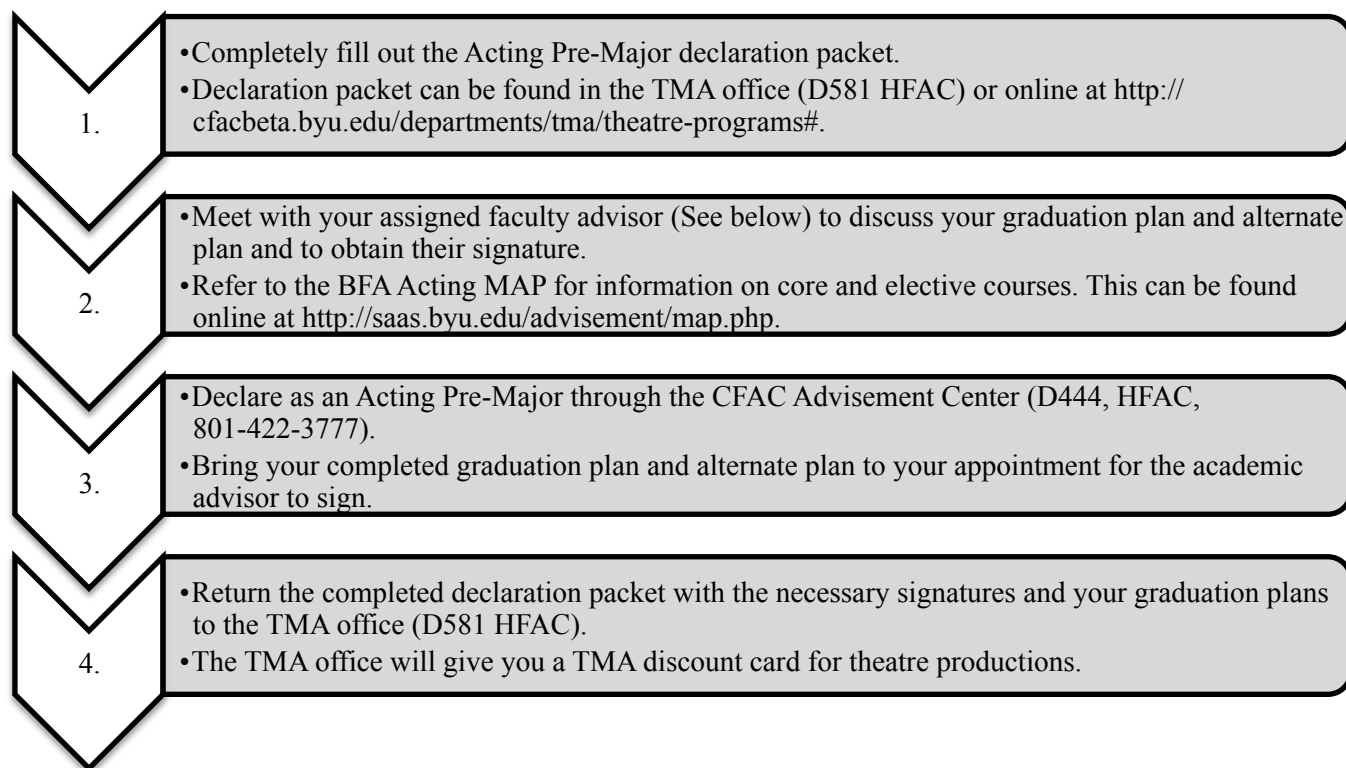


Acting Pre-Major Declaration

The BFA Acting Program is a limited enrollment major that accepts students based on their performance in two proficiency auditions. Students must be declared pre-majors before their first proficiency.
